Responsibilities**

1. Deanery contact for Liturgical commission for a three year period.
2. Act as a liaison for with the commission and the deanery, dean, etc. to get information out about liturgical training days, guidelines for rituals, documents, etc. This would come from the commission and then asked that the liaison get the info out to the deanery parishes.
3. You may want to set up a contact person for each parish to get information out from you or you may want to do this yourself. If there is no contact in the parish you may want to send info to the secretary or whomever does the parish bulletin. Always send a copy to the parish priest to keep him informed.
4. Quarterly meetings with the Diocesan Liturgical Commission for feedback, input, etc. from 3:00- 5:00 at the chancery on Sunday afternoons. If you are unable to make the meeting it is important for you to either send someone in your place to bring information back to you or to contact the DLC liaison to get you updated on what was covered.
5. Open to continue personal faith formation in both doctrine and theology and liturgical formation. This would be a personal commitment to continue your own understanding of the liturgical documents of the church.

It will require some time on your part so you will need to evaluate your own schedule both personally, professionally, and with the church to see if you have the time to commit to this kind of work.
